

Family Corner

Next week we celebrate the cornerstone of our faith: Trinity Sunday. As Catholics, we honor the Trinity in so many ways that they have become simply rote, unthinking ways of doing things: e.g. We "sandwich" our prayer with the Trinitarian "In the name of the Father and of the Son..." Most of the time we don't even bother saying all the words but slur them together so it would be hard to even know what we were saying.

We make the sign of the cross, using a Trinitarian formula and again in such a way that observers think we are batting flies. (They have said that to me.) Just what is the big deal about these little prayers, rituals? The big deal is:

We are called to have a relationship with our God, not a vague, unknowable god, but a particular relationship with Father, Son and Spirit. Jesus reveals the Father, and himself, and the Spirit.

In John's Gospel he begins with, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God!" Before all else was created Jesus was "in" the Father and the Father "in" him. The Word is in God's mind as a perfect, infinitely beautiful expression of God. The Father and he are one; "Philip, he who sees me, sees the Father..." Jesus is the perfect revealer of the Father.

The Spirit is the common love by which the Father and Son love each other. The Spirit is the Son's mutual loving of the Father, and the Father's mutual loving of the Son—an eternal exchange: Gift-that-is-given and Gift-that-is-received. Jesus said he would send *another Advocate* like himself from the Father. He said the Father would send the Spirit in the name of the Son.

Before he ascended, Jesus breathed on his disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit!" This week let's prepare for Trinity Sunday by being conscious of how we use the Trinity at prayer. Be conscious of the words as we say the Sign of the Cross and say the Glory Be.

May the Trinity speak to our hearts and open our eyes and very being to that wonderful mystery of LOVE we are asked to follow. Blessed Trinity Sunday!

Guess?

Guess how many plastic gallon milk jugs are needed to make one ton? I doubt that you guessed correctly. It takes 13,973 (exact count!!!) to weigh one ton. That many milk jugs would be quite a pile. Once the jugs are baled, there is a market for them. It costs to haul the light, bulky milk jugs to a site with a baler, to bale them and then transport the bales to market.

You can now put together # 1 and # 2 plastics in the recycling bin. Sutter located a place that takes # 1 and # 2 plastics together. Caps and lids must be removed and discarded. Rinse and then crush the jugs and bottles as much as you can. Place steel cans in the two large cardboard boxes located at one end of the recycling bin. Cardboard goes in the recycling bin designated for cardboard only. Put aluminum cans and plastic shopping bags in the two barrels inside the Paper Depot. Discard black bags and bags that were in direct contact with food. Plastic bags must be clean.

Donations are needed to defray the cost of recycling the plastics, steel cans and cardboard. Please make a donation when you bring recyclable plastics and cardboard. The drop-box for donations is under the blue awning at the northwest corner of the Paper Depot.
